2023 Finances

The section allocated \$777 for the Annual Meetings of the ASA in August 2023. Total expenses were \$712, so we were \$65 below budget. As of the period ending August 31, 2023, the section's net assets had increased from \$1,283 to \$1,384.

In collaboration with our section information officers, Andre Buscariolli and Andrew Chalfoun, we produced and distributed three section newsletters that shared section news and information about events, including three webinars that were held between Sept 2022-Aug 2023. The newsletter also profiles faculty and graduate students, spotlighting their research and contributions to the section. The current co-chairs (Danielle Pillet-Shore and Jason Turowetz) posted news announcements on the section's ASA Connect forum, where we also made current and past newsletters accessible to members. These electronic media (including recordings of our webinars) are currently being relocated following the closure of ASA Connect.

We made every effort to have a diverse membership in terms of geography, race/ethnicity, abilities, genders, and sexualities. We have a robust number of international scholars who are members of our section, and people come from all over the world to attend our meetings and events. Our council members are also quite diverse and have the potential to draw a diverse audience. We also created newsletters and webinars to reach and attract graduate students and faculty from many different countries and socioeconomic backgrounds. These efforts were in keeping with our members' commitment to celebrate and promote diversity through our research, writing, and teaching.

The current co-chairs and Section Session organizers (Danielle Pillet-Shore and Jason Turowetz) worked closely with the Regular Session organizer (Dirk vom Lehn) to maximize EMCA member participation at ASA 2023. We held four paper sessions, each with audience sizes of approximately 40 people. We also scheduled an in-person social hour/reception, a business meeting during which we presented awards, and a council meeting. Leading up to and during these events, we encouraged an intellectual exchange of ideas, aiming to give voice to various perspectives and methodologies relevant to our EMCA section's interests. We also supported mentoring and networking among our students and faculty, so that all interested parties felt welcomed and included.

We scheduled and publicized virtual/remote webinar sessions in December 2022, March/April 2023, and May 2023. We recruited and retained two graduate student Information Officers/Newsletter Editors who are in regular communication with fellow EMCA students and can help us design our events and programming to fit the interests and needs of junior scholars. Each of our virtual events has mentoring and networking potential built into it, which makes them attractive and useful for early career members. We also met with the EMCA Council via Zoom in January 2023 to review Section business mid-year and discuss ways to increase membership, ideas for future webinars, and discuss panel topic proposals to submit to ASA for a possible invited panel.
